DISCUSSION GUIDE

ROMANS | LOVE'S PRIORITY MARCH 30/31 | ROMANS 14:13-15:13

FOR STARTERS

- 1. Looking back at your notes from this week's teaching, was there anything that particularly caught your attention, challenged you or raised questions?
- 2. The past three weeks we have been reflecting on what it looks like to be devoted to one another in love (Romans 12:9). What have you been learning about the subject and yourself?

DIGGING IN

- 1. Read Romans 14:13-23.
 - In what way does Paul change the focus of their attention and what were they focused on more? cf Romans 14:13, 17
 - How does Paul's instruction here differ from 14:1-12?
 - What happens when we place our personal freedom in Christ before loving others (vv 15-20)?
 - What are the principles Paul is teaching in vv 19, 22-23?
- 2. Read Romans 15:1-6. What is the repeated word in vv 1-3? What is the principle Paul is teaching, who is the chief example of the principle and what happens (v 6) when we live out this truth in our lives?
- 3. In 15:7-13, Paul summarizes what he stated in 14:1, reminding us the reason we accept each other is that through the work of Christ, God has accepted both Jews and Gentiles! How does Paul's blessing in 15:13 help us better love God's people and His mission?

BRINGING IT HOME

- 1. How does this teaching challenge the thinking of culture and in what ways should we be personally challenged?
- 2. What is God asking you to change in your attitudes, thinking and behavior?
